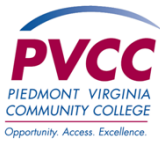


About Us

Analyst Boot Camp (ABC) Curriculum

Analyst Boot Camp is a rigorous program that teaches the skills necessary to join the Intelligence Community (IC) as an analyst. U.S. citizenship and eligibility for security clearance are required.

Courses begin at the unclassified level and transition as students gain their security clearances. Throughout the program, students are challenged with analytic exercises as well as writing and briefing assignments on current intelligence issues.

The Analyst Boot Camp consists of the following instruction:

Upon completion of the ABC, students with no previous intelligence experience may be qualified for entry-level positions in the intelligence workforce with government, military, private industry or academia.

*Classified data is used in these sessions.

- ABC courses are offered on an individual basis for those seeking additional skills or experience.
- Any portion of the ABC can be customized for companies wishing to train a group of employees.

Who Should Attend?

The ABC is ideal for:

- Individuals with a bachelor's degree interested in a career in intelligence.
- Workers in the Intelligence Community who are waiting for clearance.
- Cleared workers who require training from intelligence basics to advanced technical intelligence.

Desired Qualifications

Minimum bachelor's degree is recommended. Previous analytical experience is a plus but not required. In certain circumstances, applicants with less than a bachelor's degree may be considered given previous experience relevant to positions attainable within the Intelligence Community or Department of Defense. Strong public speaking skills, writing skills, and proficiency in Microsoft Office products are also desired.
