

ENROLLMENT OF HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS AT PVCC

ANNUAL REPORT 2019-20

OVERVIEW

Each semester, hundreds of high school students enroll in credit courses at Piedmont Virginia Community College (PVCC). The majority of these students are dual-enrolled in face-to-face classes at their high schools, receiving both high school and college credit for classes completed. There are also many public, private high schools, and home-schooled students¹ in the PVCC service region whom take PVCC classes online and/or come to campus to take college classes. Overall, 2,117 high school students accounted for 6,035 enrollments and 18,420 total credits in the 2019-20 academic year. The table below summarizes the academic year 2019-20 enrollment of high school students at PVCC.

DUAL-ENROLLMENT FACE-TO-FACE CLASSES IN REGIONAL PUBLIC AND PRIVATE HIGH SCHOOLS

PVCC offered face-to-face dual-enrollment courses at Albemarle High School, Blue Ridge School, CATEC, Center One, Charlottesville High School, Fork Union Military Academy, Fluvanna County High School, Louisa County High School, Miller School of Albemarle, Monticello High School, Murray High School, Nelson County High School, Western Albemarle High School, and William Monroe High School in 2019-20 academic year. During the year, there were 5,367 enrollments in these classes by 2,003 students, generating 16,342 total credits.

Private schools within the PVCC service region include Blue Ridge School, Fort Union Military Academy, and Miller School of Albemarle.

⁷It should be noted that this total differs from the FTE report total as the FTE report factors only those courses that are classified as "ODUAL" and can be either face-to-face or virtual. This report includes all students in ODUAL, plus those with academic plan 041, 042, or 043. These students may be enrolled in courses on PVCC's main campus, virtually, or at high school locations.

VIRTUAL/ON-LINE CLASSES

An additional 189 public, private, or homeschool students enrolled in PVCC classes online, generating 955 total credits. Some high schools provide proctored class time for students to take PVCC courses online.

CLASSES ON A PVCC CAMPUS

134 high school students took PVCC classes on a PVCC campus (i.e., at the main campus, the Albemarle location, the Jefferson City Center campus, or the Giuseppe Center campus). This activity generated 1,123 total credits.

COMMUNITY BENEFIT

Due to the relationship that PVCC and surrounding public and private high schools have, students saved \$2,599,040⁸ by taking courses as dual enrollment.

EARLY COLLEGE EXPERIENCE

The Early College Experience provides high school students the opportunity to graduate with an associate's degree by the time they complete high school. For academic year 2019-20, there were 136 students enrolled as a part of this initiative. This academic year, Albemarle High School, Charlottesville High School, Fluvanna County High School, Louisa County High School, Nelson County High School, Western Albemarle High School, and William Monroe High School had students enrolled through this program.
