



**Graduate Awards Detailed Report  
2019-2020**

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## Introduction

This report describes PVCC graduate data for 2019-2020. The first half of this report provides details on the graduates and the second half provides details on the awards. The abbreviations used by the VCCS are given in the table below. For categories where the total number of graduates is less than five, the percent will be reported, but not the total number.

For 2019-2020, PVCC conferred 1,215 awards to 893 graduates.

## Graduates

The majority of graduates received degrees in college transfer programs (44%), followed by career studies certificates (22%), certificates (18%), and then career technical (16%). The majority of graduates were female (n = 545, 61%), in-state (n = 884, 99%), and within the age category of 20 to 21 (n = 25%). The ethnicity/race distribution of the graduates is similar to that of the overall population of the college for 2019-2020. Table 2 examines the graduates' demographics.

## Awards

The following section provides data on the awards conferred by type of award, program degree structure, awards conferred by underrepresented populations, and by program.

Graduates from PVCC can earn multiple awards upon graduating. Table 8 shows the number of graduates who received between one, two, three, or four awards.

The majority of graduates received degrees in college transfer associate degree programs (33%), followed by certificates (32%), career studies certificates (CSC) (23%) and then career technical associate degrees (12%). Table 11 shows the number of awards and percent of total awards for PVCC’s underrepresented population as well as first-generation graduates. The current VCCS definition for underrepresented or underserved populations to include “any student who is first-generation (both mother’s and father’s education are high school graduate or below), minority (any student not white/Caucasian or unknown), or Pell-eligible (as indicated by ISIR as of the award year)”. For the 2019-2020 academic year, graduates in the underrepresented population accounted for over half of the awards conferred.
