### NOTES:

- **Students transferring credits TO PVCC:** Transferred courses may fulfill a requirement under PVCC's approved electives (above). Students may check their transfer credit report in SIS.
  - Transfer credits for \*\*\*EEE may fulfill the corresponding Social Science Elective, Humanities Elective, or Transfer Elective only.
  - MTH EEE will *not* meet the Mathematics Transfer Elective.
- Students may petition the appropriate dean to substitute a course not listed above.
- **Note to students transferring credits FROM PVCC TO FOUR-YEAR INSTITUTIONS:** Although a course fulfills a requirement for a PVCC program, it is possible the same course will not fulfill a requirement at a four-year institution. Students who plan to transfer need to be aware of the four-year institution's requirements.
